July Fun Fly Results – Limbo

This month's event attracted a variety of pilots who dared to test their flying skills for the Limbo Challenge. Each pilot was instructed to take off and make their test fly-by's, then call out when they were ready to approach the Limbo. Planes had to fly under the ribbon with wheels not touching the runway in a series of 3 rounds. Of course, no points were given if the plane touched either of the two vertical limbo sticks. As usual, a north to northwest wind at 10-15mph added excitement to the event.

During the first round, the limbo ribbon was set up at 6 feet high with downward increments of 12 inches after each succession. After each successful flight, a point was given to the pilot. If the ribbon was cut or a pilot called off his approach, zero points were added to his score.

To start the event, our club Secretary, Mr. Tom Spriet set up his electric e-flight Funtana and showed everyone how easy it was to make the first limbo. JT followed the same path with his yellow Twist, but had a slight wind updraft and his prop cut the ribbon. Dan Morgan brought out his Delta Wing and flew under the ribbon doing about 75 mph with no complaints. Pretty cool Danny Boy! Our new FVAC member, Alvin Cole took his Pulse XT40 through the first round with cool hands, however his tail clipped the ribbon and he returned safely ready for a second chance.

During the second round, the pilots sense more anxiety as the wind started to gust. Tom Spriet was in the air and made several passes for determining position to secure another point. Just as he approached the limbo, the wind caught his plane and Tom gave left rudder for a quick adjustment and clipped the vertical pole. A damaged wing caused Tom to withdraw from the competition. JT approached the flight line and took off to the west, circled twice and called his mark. He came down the flight line and cleared the ribbon capturing a point with a safe landing. Dan Morgan launched his Delta Wing and did not have enough airspeed and altitude; therefore he skidded onto the grass and broke his prop. The CD agreed to allow Dan a 2nd try. After a new prop was locked back on, Dan got his flying wing into the air and came towards the limbo at a high speed run and made the pass, but cut the ribbon. Alvin got his Pulse warmed up and took off. He flew under the ribbon to capture his first point. After he landed, Alvin called his wife about the good news. I told Alvin he was now tied for first. I think he called his wife again!

Now for the final round, a 3 way tie for first was now between "Delta" Dan, Alvin, and JT. The ribbon bar was now moved down to 3 feet above the ground and all pilots were looking to sky determining a strategy for capturing the first place recognition.

JT started his dependable Twist and took off. His attempt was successful and came back to the pits with some shaken nerves. Delta Dan made his attempt, but cut the ribbon and decided to cut some holes in the sky to burn off some fuel. Alvin "The Pulse" Cole came in and cleared the ribbon making his the 3rd round a new tie for first place.

For determining the "tie-breaker", the pilots agreed to keep the limbo bar at the same location and have a 4th and final fly off round. While Alvin "The Pulse" Cole was still up in the air, we called to him and requested his best approach to score the final round. Alvin set up and made an attempt with a final call off, but he proceeded to go through the Limbo and sliced the ribbon. While the ground crew replaced the ribbon, JT "The Twist" fueled up and taxied to the runway and took off. After a high speed past, he circled and flew around for his final approach and got under the ribbon, however he escaped with a broken prop and landed safely. The "tie breaker" was completed with JT finishing the 1st with Alvin placing 2nd and Delta Dan coming in 3rd!
